The following DOSH/OSHA Recordable has occurred. In an effort to prevent similar injuries from occurring at your location, please review the injury summary shown below. Remember that a Supervisor's Incident Report is to be completed and faxed to ERNWest, within 24 hours of notification of the incident. Every accident/incident will be investigated regardless of the extent of injuries. Even a near miss or minor injury can give you causes that may stop a more serious accident from occurring in the future. Your experienced based recommendations and ideas for prevention of such an accident are welcomed and **needed**.

I. Injury Summary:

Date Of Injury:	6-25-2007
Date Reported:	6-25-2007
Injury Type:	Burn to Left Pinky Finger
Injury Cause:	Deli manager was cleaning out pasta station in deli department. As employee was cleaning the station, her chef coat brushed against the pilot light igniting the coat. Employee looked down and noticed she was on fire. She used her left hand to brush out the flames burning her left finger. Employee reported incident to supervisor and went to the local occupational health clinic where she was given ointment for her burns.
Action Taken to Prevent Reoccurrence:	Safety committee is currently reviewing incident to provide suggestions on how to eliminate hazard during clean-up. One idea is to provide flame resistant chef coats to employees cleaning around open pilot lights. Incident was discussed at monthly safety meeting. Employees were reminded of the dangers of cleaning around burning pilot lights.
